Adult Arts and Crafts Department Rules:

1. **State Fair General Rules apply to this department. By entering, you agree to read and abide by all State Fair General Rules and the rules of this department.**
2. Use the Adult Arts and Crafts entry form or use on-line registration. No late additions or alterations of entries are permitted. Mailed forms postmarked after September 4 will not be accepted.
3. All articles for competition must be entered in the name of an individual competitor. Articles must be the handiwork of that individual and completed within the last year/since last year's Fair (except articles of interest, old or antique) No unfinished articles will be accepted. **Articles created by professionals, teachers, etc. will not be eligible for competition, except where indicated.** Employees of the Arts and Crafts Department are not permitted to compete in this department. Students in grades K through 12 attending school in Virginia or youth 18 years old and under must enter in the Youth Arts & Crafts Department, except Section 94, Parent/Child Cookies.
4. List article on entry form according to DIVISION and CLASS. You may make **only one entry per class** with no more than 20 items entered all together in the Arts and Crafts department. As a competitor, you are solely responsible for deciding on the proper DIVISION and CLASS for your entry. Entries improperly classified will not be changed or judged. We reserve the right to accept or refuse an exhibit. **NEW: Photography divisions are limited to 10 pieces total per exhibitor.**
5. No article will be accepted unless there is a DIVISION and CLASS covering it as listed in the Competition Guide. Articles entered in the "Miscellaneous" or "Other" classes must not fit in any class listed elsewhere in the Guide. No entry tag will be sent if the competitor does not name and describe the article entered in "Miscellaneous" or "Other" class on entry form. Information on mailing completed items is found in the General Rules of this publication.
6. Upon receiving and processing your entry form, the State Fair will mail entry identification tags for you to attach to articles for exhibit. Altered tags will not be accepted, but you may add requested information to the back of the tag. If the item is original or unusual, please include that information on the BACK of the tag. Items consisting of multiple parts must be connected, mounted or stabilized in some way to keep all pieces together. You must retain "claim check" part of entry tag to claim article on pick-up days.

7. The Fair assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to exhibited items from any cause. Any insurance desired on an entry must be carried by the individual who entered it. No one will be allowed to set up, remove, handle or rearrange exhibits. Security will be provided. Every possible care will be taken to protect the exhibit and competitor's materials. All articles will be entirely under the control and jurisdiction of the State Fair of Virginia until pick-up days. ***NOTE: For 2009, Arts & Crafts Hall will be a temporary structure, not a permanent building.**
8. If space does not permit a display of all entries, those without ribbons will be stored until day of return. **No materials will be released before 8 a.m., Tuesday, October 6, 2009. The Arts & Crafts Department will not be responsible for articles left after 6 p.m., Wednesday, Oct. 7. We do NOT have year-round storage facilities; items will be thrown away after 6 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 7.**

SPECIAL POPULATIONS - (no entry fees for these divisions)

Individuals with special needs are invited to enter in any sections they desire. In addition, we offer the following special sections:

Therapeutic Recreation - The State Fair of Virginia encourages participants in programs serving the disabled, nursing homes and hospitals to exhibit and compete with each other in the Therapeutic Recreation Section. Entries are to be clearly labeled with the name of the institution or program and the name of the competitor on each entry form. Because of limited display area, we ask that individuals enter no more than two items in this section.

Senior Citizens - Senior citizens may compete in the special sections set up for seniors. Items entered in Sections 34 and 35, Senior Citizens 65(80) years or older, must be the work of that person or in memory of the creator of the work. Seniors who compete in this section may also enter in the other Arts and Crafts sections as desired, up to the allowed 20 items total.

Rules:

1. Only ONE entry per person per class. Amateur photographers only. Prints may be made by commercial printers. Besides basic post-processing such as adjustment of brightness, contrast, color and sharpness, digital manipulations are NOT allowed (except in Class 2018 & 2019). Photo must be entrant's own work and must have been taken since June 1, 2008 with the exception of "A Fair to Remember." **NEW: Due to display space limitations, exhibitors are limited to 10 pieces of photography total in Divisions 2A, 2B & 2C.**
2. **Description of Classes**
 - Portraits:** Depiction of a personality, head or full figure, posed or informal (not candid) where the person is the main interest. Duos are permitted.
 - Human Interest:** Candid, people interacting, family moments
 - Scenic and Architectural:** Landscapes, water, sunsets, buildings, roads, etc.
 - Garden:** must include a person in a garden - either flower or vegetable
 - Floral:** Flowers, plants - cultivated or wild
 - Animals:** Wild or domestic, pets
 - Children:** Including babies
 - A Fair to Remember:** Color and black and white photographs depicting any aspect of State Fair activity
 - Humor:** Make us laugh! Any subject; color, black & white, or alternative process may be used
 - Digital Manipulation:** Go digital! Any subject; digitally manipulated photograph. Manipulated image must be an original scanned work(s) of art by the exhibitor, with the finished work of art being designed as to not copy an original photograph or work of art by another person. The submitted work must reflect original intent by the submitting exhibitor.
3. All prints must be matted or mounted on matt board with a **white mat with a minimum of 1 1/2" and a maximum of 3"**. No framed photos or poster board.
4. Using the string provided with entry tag, securely attach string to the back so that tag will hang over top left edge of picture as viewed by the judges.
5. Guidelines for judging: a. Impact b. Composition c. Lighting d. Simplicity

Photographs that show children must be accompanied by a signed release from the child's parent or legal guardian. Please see page following entry form for waiver to be used.

Rules:

The quilt show is open to amateurs, professionals and seniors.

Each quilt should have a 6" sleeve (for hanging purposes) sewn onto the back side of the quilt as close to the top edge as possible, *before* they are delivered to the Fair.

QUILTS WILL NOT BE DISPLAYED WITHOUT A SLEEVE.

For fairness in judging, please stitch a piece of fabric covering the name of the competitor before delivering the quilt to the Fair.

1. All quilts must be clean, free of smoke or odor, constructed of fabric and quilted.
2. All entries must have been *completed* after 2007 and never exhibited at the State Fair of Virginia.
3. There is a limit of one quilt per person, per class. A quilt may be entered in only one class.
4. Quilts that do not meet these requirements will not be judged or displayed. These competitors will be notified. Entries submitted in the wrong category will be evaluated and displayed, but will not receive an award.
5. **Please include quilt dimensions** in description field of entry form.

Judged on workmanship, appearance, design, beauty and originality, appropriateness, harmony of colors, and material. **No machine embroidery** should be entered in this section. In counted cross stitch, ALL CROSSES MUST BE GOING IN THE SAME DIRECTION in order to be judged. All plastic canvas must be entered in class 7018. All articles must be finished and ready for use either as a framed picture, a pillow, or appropriate use as a tray insert or article of clothing.

In classes 7001, 7002 and 7003, the majority of the design should be counted cross stitch; otherwise, it should go in Class 7013.

All articles should be clean and pressed. Pictures should be framed and ready for hanging. If using non-glare glass, make certain it does not have etching.

All entries must be labeled with name of fiber, approximate proportions of fiber types in blends (i.e. 70% wool, 30% silk), preparation method, dye (if dyed), breed of animal if known, number of plies, equipment used and proposed use of finished yarn (knitting, weaving, crochet, lace, etc.)

Example:

50% wool, 47% mohair, 3% lurex in a commercially dyed and carded batt, recarded to blend colors on a drum carder and spun as a 2-ply spiral novelty yarn on a flyer wheel. Use: handknitting yarn.

- 1605 Hand Dyeing: 2 oz. skein of handspun natural fiber yarn (1-2 oz. cellulose or luxury fibers), indicate dye used and technique. Examples: Fiber reactive dyes applied directly on silkcaps, steam set; wool fleece vat dyed in weld, skein overdyed with indigo.
- 1606 Spinner's Workbasket: 8 oz. or more handspun yarn to complete a specific project with tools, findings, etc. attractively arranged. Must include pattern, sketch, swatch, or directions for proposed project.
- 1607 Finished Wearable - Handspun
- 1608 Spinner's Choice: Any other fiber craft item from handspun or unspun textile fibers. May include rugs, towels, tapestry, bags, felted fibers, jewelry, etc.
- 1609 Modern Techno Fibers - Soy silk, nylon flash, ingeo, bamboo etc. 1-2 oz. skein.

Apple Pie

Ingredients:

1/3 cup sugar
1/3 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
1/8 teaspoon salt
6 firm pie apples
Pastry for one 9-inch, double crust pie

Method:

- Combine sugars flour, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt in a small bowl.
- Peel apples and cut into thin slices.
- Sprinkle the sugar mixture over the apples and toss lightly until the apples are completely coated.
- Roll out half of the pastry dough and place it in a 9-inch pie plate.
- Spoon the filling into the pastry shell.
- Roll out the remaining dough and place it over the apples. Seal and crimp the crust, and prick or slash the top of the pie.
- Bake the pie in a pre-heated 350°F oven, until it is golden brown and bubbly, about an hour.

Pie Pastry

(Makes one double crust 9-inch pie)

Ingredients:

2 1/2 cups (10 ounces) unbleached all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup (8 ounces) unsalted butter, chilled and divided in half
1/4 to 1/2 cup (2 to 4 ounces) ice water

Method:

- Combine the flour and the salt in a mixing bowl.
- Cut in half the chilled butter using a pastry blender or your fingers. For a tender result, the fat particles should be worked in quickly and remain about the size of currants.
- Cut in the remaining butter, this time leaving larger shards, about the size of dried cranberries.
- Sprinkle about three tablespoons of the ice water over the flour/fat mixture and mix just until the dough begins to mass. You may need to add the additional tablespoon of ice water for this to occur.
- Remove the dough mass to a work surface, divide into two equal portions and press into flattened rounds about six inches in diameter. Wrap each in plastic wrap and chill for at least 1/2 hour.

To roll a single crust:

- Remove one piece of dough from the refrigerator and place on a well-floured surface or between sheets of plastic wrap or parchment paper. Roll the dough from the center out, taking care not to roll over the edges. A circle of 13 inches will suffice for a 9-inch pie tin.
- Transfer the dough to the pie plate by first folding the circle in half and then into quarters. Place the point of the quartered dough at the center of the pie tin and gently unfold.

For a double crust pie:

- Roll the top dough the same as the bottom one and transfer to cover the filling in the same manner (folding the circle in quarters).
- Trim the crust so the top crust is about 1/4 inch shorter than the bottom one. Lift both layers of dough together and fold the bottom layer over the top, resting them on the edge of the pie tin.
- Seal the edge by fluting or crimping, using your fingers, a fork or any kitchen implement to achieve a sealed and decorative edge.
- Vent the top of the pie with some slits to prevent the juices from boiling over.

* This is a tender, all-purpose pie dough. To add a nuance of sweetness and flavor, 4 tablespoons of confectioner's sugar can be included with the dry ingredients and 1 teaspoon of vanilla with the water.

- Open to any individual who is a Virginia resident; one entry per person. Participant does not have to reside in county where fair is held. Local fairs are asked to waive any residency requirements. Participants are eligible to participate in ONE contest one time only.
- Entrant must begin the dessert with a baked angel food cake, made from 'scratch' - no mixes used. It can be the base of any type of dessert (ex: Trifle, pudding, molded dessert, rolled cake, torte, cupcakes, etc.). Any type of cake pan used is acceptable.
- A minimum of 10 large eggs must be cracked (Angel food cakes use egg whites).
- Frosting or icing is optional. If the dessert is submitted frosted or glazed, the recipe for frosting, icing or glaze must be included on the same sheet. Include garnish in recipe.
- Entire dessert must be submitted on cardboard or a disposable container for judging.
- Recipe must list ingredients in order of use. Preparation instructions, pan size (and type) and cooking time and temperatures, must be included. Written recipe must be printed on one side of page and must be submitted with the baked entry. Reverse side of page must include recipe contestant's name, address, phone and email address.
- This is an adult competition. Contestants under age 18 will be judged as an adult.
- Recipes become property of the Virginia Egg Council.
- Judging will be based on the following criteria:

a. Flavor	25 points
b. Overall Appearance	25 points
c. Moistness and Crumb/Texture	20 points
d. Followed Recipe Requirements	15 points
e. Creativity (appearance, ingredients, etc.)	<u>15 points</u>
