The Youth Arts and Crafts competitions are divided into the following age divisions:

Age on September 4, 2009: Ages 5 - 8 Ages 9 - 13 Ages 14 - 18

You MUST provide correct age for the entry form to be automatically entered in the appropriate age division.

Youth Arts and Crafts Department Rules:

1. State Fair General Rules apply to this department. By entering, you agree to read and abide by all State Fair rules and Youth Arts and Crafts rules.
2. Individuals entering the Youth Arts and Crafts Department must be between the ages of 5 and 18. Articles entered must be the work of the youth competitor and must have been completed within the last year. No passes will be issued to individuals competing in this department.
3. Only one individual may enter per entry form. Teachers and schools may enter items made by a group of students in the classes which specify group projects. The age of the oldest child participating will determine which age group to enter.
4. List article on entry form according to DIVISION and CLASS as found in the Competition Guide. You are allowed **only one entry per class** with no more than 20 items entered all together in the Youth Arts and Crafts department. As a competitor, you are solely responsible for deciding on the proper DIVISION and CLASS for your entry. Entries improperly classified will not be corrected or judged. We reserve the right to accept or refuse any entry.
5. Upon receiving and processing your entry form and processing fee, the State Fair will mail entry identification tags for you to attach to articles for competition. Altered tags will not be accepted, but you may add requested information to the back of the tag. You must retain "claim check" part of entry tag to claim article at close of the Fair.

6. The Fair assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to exhibited items from any cause. Any insurance desired on an entry must be carried by the individual who entered it. No one will be allowed to set up, remove, handle or rearrange exhibits. Security will be provided. Every possible care will be taken to protect the exhibit and competitor's materials. All articles will be entirely under the control and jurisdiction of the State Fair of Virginia until after the close of the Fair. ***NOTE: For 2009, Arts & Crafts Hall will be a temporary structure, not a permanent building.**
7. Where there is only one item entered in a class, a blue ribbon, if merited, will be awarded. Where articles are not worthy of first prize, judges may, at their discretion, award a ribbon of such grade as the article deserves.
8. If space does not permit a display of all materials, those without ribbons will be stored until day of return. **No materials will be released before 8 a.m., Tuesday, October 6, 2009. The Youth Arts & Crafts Department will not be responsible for articles left after 6 p.m., Wednesday, October 7, 2009. We do NOT have year-round storage facilities: items will be thrown away after 6 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 7.**

Rules

1. All contestants must pre-register. Individuals and teams of up to four people may enter (teams should enter under a group name and one teacher/contact person; include names/ages of participants AND name of book on entry form).
2. Enter early! Due to space limitations, only a limited number of entries will be accepted.
3. Include in the following in your display: book title and author on which the display is based, menu of what you would serve for your character, and anything else that would make for a perfect lunch with your favorite literary character!
4. No food is permitted on table, with the exception of nonperishable foods.
5. No item in the display may be over 18 inches tall. View of other tables cannot be blocked.
6. All tables will be exhibited in an enclosed area.
7. All tables will be furnished by the Fair and will be uniform in size (round- 35").
8. Participants should provide tablecloths.
9. Complete instructions will be mailed after your entry form is processed.

Division 26: PHOTOGRAPHY

Photography Rules:

1. Only ONE entry per person per class. Amateur photographers only. Prints may be made by commercial printers. Besides basic post-processing such as adjustment of brightness, contrast, color and sharpness, digital manipulations are NOT allowed (except in Class 2018). Photo must be entrant's own work and must have been taken since June 1, 2008 with the exception of "A Fair to Remember." **NEW: Due to display space limitations, exhibitors are limited to 10 pieces of photography total in Divisions 26A, 26B & 26C.**
2. **Description of Classes**
 - Portraits:** Depiction of a personality, head or full figure, posed or informal (not candid) where the person is the main interest. Duos are permitted.
 - Human Interest:** Candid, people interacting, family moments
 - Scenic and Architectural:** Landscapes, water, sunsets, buildings, roads, etc.
 - Garden:** must include a person in a garden - either flower or vegetable
 - Floral:** Flowers, plants - cultivated or wild
 - Animals:** Wild or domestic, pets
 - Children:** Including babies
 - A Fair to Remember:** Color and black and white photographs depicting any aspect of State Fair activity
 - Humor:** Make us laugh! Any subject; color, black & white, or alternative process may be used
 - Digital Manipulation:** Go digital! Any subject; digitally manipulated photograph. Manipulated image must be an original scanned work(s) of art by the exhibitor, with the finished work of art being designed as to not copy an original photograph or work of art by another person. The submitted work must reflect original intent by the submitting exhibitor.
3. All prints must be matted or mounted on matt board with a **white mat with a minimum of 1 1/2" and a maximum of 3"**. **No framed photos, foam core or poster board.**
4. Using the string provided with entry tag, securely attach string to the back so that tag will hang over top left edge of picture as viewed by the judges.
5. Guidelines for judging: a. Impact b. Composition c. Lighting d. Simplicity

Photographs that show children must be accompanied by a signed release from the child's parent or legal guardian. Please see page following entry form for waiver to be used.

Youth Arts & Crafts Sweepstakes Award \$50.00 and Rosette

The Youth Arts & Crafts Sweepstakes Award will be awarded to the individual who enters the most outstanding collection of winning entries. All must be the work of the individual youth competitor. The judges' decision will be based on the variety of categories entered and the number of first place ribbons won. Second and third place ribbons will be counted if there is a tie.

Division 61: ELECTRONIC MEDIA COMPETITION

Limit of Entries: Limit of one entry per student, per competition class.

Eligibility: Projects may be the work of an individual or group and done within the last year. Submit a list of the names, birthdates, addresses and signatures of all students who worked on the project. Submit list with the entry form.

Special Rules

Achievement of Implied Goals and Objectives:

Does the design meet or exceed the needs or wants of the targeted audience?

Innovation:

Does the design introduce new ways of using technology to teach and/or entertain the target audience?

Creativity:

Does the design attack the subject matter in an original and interesting way?

Interface:

Is the user interface easy to navigate? Is the design clean, and elegant, not cluttered.

Baked Goods and Candies

1. All entries must be put in clear zip top plastic bags and placed on disposable plates (exception: cakes, candy and cookie jar categories) with entry tags properly attached. Complete instructions will be mailed with your entry identification tags.
2. **NEW DATE:** Baked goods and candies must be brought to the **Arts and Crafts Hall on Wednesday, September 23, between 7:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.**
3. Decorated cakes to be judged on decorations only so forms may be used. Cakes are to be on cardboard base or disposable plate not to exceed 13 inches square. Cakes not to exceed 18" tall, including decorations.
4. **All baked goods become the property of the State Fair of Virginia and will not be returned. Baked items that are not placed on display will be sent to a local food bank.**

King Arthur Flour Awesome Banana Bread

- 2 large eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 cup mashed ripe bananas (2 -3 bananas)
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 2 2/3 cups King Arthur All-purpose or White Whole Wheat Flour
- 1 cup plain yogurt (low fat or fat free)
- 1 cup of any of the following: chopped nuts, dried fruit, chocolate chips, coconut (optional)

Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease and flour a 9 X 5-inch loaf pan. In a medium-sized bowl, beat together eggs, sugar, and oil. Stir in mashed bananas. In a separate bowl, whisk together baking soda, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, and flour. Quickly add all the dry ingredients to the banana mixture. Stir in yogurt and nuts (or fruit or chocolate chips). Stir just until combined. Pour mixture into prepared pan. Bake 1 hour. Cover loosely with foil if bread browns too quickly. Let bread rest for 10 minutes. Remove bread from pan and cool on a rack.
