Cashmere Goat Show Rules:

The State Fair General Rules, the Livestock Rules and the Show Ring Code of Ethics apply to this department. By submitting an entry you agree to read and abide by these rules.

1. **Goat Show (does, wethers, and bucks):** Entry fee is \$4.00 per class and includes first bedding. All other bedding and feed is furnished by the exhibitor. Group classes will only be charged one entry fee (not per animal).
2. ENTER ONLINE at www.statefairva.org, under 'State Fair' and then 'Competitions' or mail Open Cashmere Goat Show entries to:

Make checks payable to the State Fair of Virginia. No late entries will be accepted.
3. Age of animal will be computed as of the date of the show.
4. Only animals that are entered and in competition or other approved activity will be allowed on Fairgrounds. Dogs are prohibited.
5. All goats must arrive with a certificate of veterinary inspection issued in their home state. See complete Health Rules for Goats in the Livestock Rules.
6. **There must be at least 50 animals shown in order for premiums to be paid.**
7. If animals are removed prior to release time, exhibitor will forfeit all premiums.
8. Awards will be withheld if pens are not left in the original configuration.
9. Check in with Cashmere Goat Show Superintendent before unloading bucks for stall assignments.

Doe/Wether Competition

1. Animals born in the year 2010 (milk teeth)
2. Animals born in the year 2009 (two teeth)
3. Animals born in the year 2008 (four teeth)
4. Animals born in the year 2007 (six teeth)
5. Animals born in the year 2006 or earlier (full mouth)
6. Dam & Daughter-List by dam's name (two entries per exhibitor) Judging will be based upon the genetic improvement exhibited by the doeling over its dam.
7. Get of sire for does- Listed by sires name. (Three entries per exhibitor) three doelings under 3 years of age sired by the same buck and out of at least two different does. Judging will be based upon the similarity of the doelings to each other.
8. Wethers – divided by age if necessary

Cashmere Fleece Competition

Entry fee is **\$6.00 per fleece**, which includes return postage. Maximum of three fleeces per class, per exhibitor. Entry instructions are available from Superintendent (434) 990-9162. Entries due September 1.

All entries will be made on-line at www.statefairva.org by September 1. Fleece packages must be postmarked on or before September 1.

Entries are limited to 3 fleeces per class per farm. Only raw fleeces harvested this season are invited (please **DO NOT** wash or process fleece in any way, but **please DO** remove vegetative matter). The whole fleece, not just a sample should be submitted.

Fleece Packaging:

- Pack each fleece in a large 2 gallon zip lock bag. (DO NOT WRITE ON BAGS).
- Include **inside the bag** with each fleece an index card containing the following information: your name, farm name, address, social security number (for cash rewards), goat's herd code (from farm on which it was born), goat's name, sex, date of birth, and whether fleece was combed or shorn.
- Please also include in box a self-addressed card (**BIG lettering**) for return mailing of fleeces- if not picked up at fair. However, we urge you to pick up the fleeces after the show, if at all possible.
- Entry fee is **\$6/fleece****, which includes return postage. Make check payable to the **State Fair of Virginia** and include check in box when fleeces are submitted.
