Youth Market Hog and Breeding Gilt Show Rules:

The State Fair General Rules, the Livestock Rules and the Show Ring Code of Ethics apply to this department. By submitting an entry you agree to read and abide by these rules.

1. 4-H and FFA members who are currently enrolled in Virginia are eligible to compete. Exhibitors must be at least 9 years of age by Sept. 30 of the current year and must not have had their 19th birthday before Jan. 1 of 2010.
2. Entries are limited to nominating 7 head of market hogs and 3 breeding gilts per exhibitor with a maximum of showing five market hogs and three breeding gilts. Hogs entered in the Market hog show are not eligible for Breeding Gilt classes and Breeding Gilt entries are not eligible for Market Hog classes. **New for 2010, all entries are on-line at www.statefairva.org, under 'State Fair' and then 'Competitions' for assistance contact Lisa Kovacs at:

3. Classes open to barrows or gilts.
4. Market hogs should have been farrowed on or after April 1, 2010. They must be owned, separated, and cared for by the exhibitor at least 75 days before the date of the show (July 20, 2010). **All hogs must be ear tagged by an approved show representative by August 16th. Contact Lisa Kovacs for more info (757-403-1764)**
5. All hogs must weigh between **220 lbs.** and **295 lbs.** in order to be eligible to show in market classes. Hogs will be weighed only once.
6. Market hogs exhibited previously in Open competition will not be permitted to show in the Youth Show.
7. Exhibitors are required to care for their hogs and to keep their pens and walkways clean at all times. Awards will be withheld if this rule is violated.
8. Any animals may be used in educational programs prior to or after the show.
9. All youth beef, sheep, and swine entries are subject to on-farm inspections to verify entry information. All exhibitors must agree to accommodate such inspections.
10. **Hair Clipping:** For show eligibility, hair length on the pig body (hams, top, sides and shoulders) must be at least one-half inch. Pigs with body hair length less than one-half inch are not eligible for the show.
11. **The market hog show will be terminal for all hogs that won a Scholarship in the Market Hog Show. (Grand Champion, Resv. Grand Champion & Class winners) All other participants can decide to sell their hogs or take them home. Please indicate your intent when you enter.**
12. **Because this is no longer only a terminal show, health certificates will be required on all hogs showing.**
13. Scales will be made available for weighing youth hogs during the Open Hog weigh in.

Show Classification

Market Hog Classes: will be made up by weight after entries are received with a reasonable number of hogs per class.

Breeding Gilt Classes:

Breeds – Both purebred and crossbred gilts are eligible, but there will NOT be specific breed classes.

Weight – Open gilts weighing up to 350 lbs; Gilts over 350 lbs. are not eligible.

Divisions – Gilts will be divided into divisions by weight. The division break points are as follows:

- 1. Prospect Division (gilts weighing up to 150 lbs.)
- 2. Progress Division (gilts weighing from 151 lbs. to 240 lbs.)
- 3. Mature Division (gilts weighing from 241 lbs. to 350 Lbs)

A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand champion will be selected from each division.

Classes: The number of classes within each of the three divisions will vary based on the number of entries (Minimum of 10 head in the division is required to be eligible to split classes).

Overall Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Gilts: The Grand Champion gilt will be selected from the three division champions. After the Grand Champion is selected the Reserve Champion from that division will return to compete for the Overall Reserve Grand Champion gilt.

Showmanship classes will be divided by age as follows:

- A. Novice Division- for exhibitors showing for the first time at the state fair, and who are 12 years of age or younger on January 1 of current year.
- B. Junior Division- exhibitors 12 years of age and younger on September 30 of current year.
- C. Intermediate Division- exhibitors 13 to 15 years of age on September 30 of current year.
- D. Senior Division- exhibitors 16 years of age and older on September 30 of current year.

Virginia Pork Industry Special Award

The **Virginia Pork Industry Association** will award a silver tray to the sweepstakes winner in the Youth Market Hog show. The winner is to be selected by the total number of points accumulated in the show by the following point system:

1st—5 points 2nd—4 points 3rd—3 points

for placings in the single classes and fitting and showing classes. In case of a tie the tying exhibitor placing highest in the fitting and showing class will receive the award.

State Fair of Virginia Scholarship Program – Market Hogs

The Scholarship Program is open to all Virginia 4-H and FFA exhibitors in their related livestock project area.

Youth exhibitors will be eligible to participate in the State Fair Scholarship Program with one entry unless the exhibitor has both overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion. **All entries/animals qualifying and designated for the Market Hog Scholarship Program must be sold and slaughtered.** If the animal is condemned for any reason, neither payment or scholarship will be awarded and the competitor must accept the consequences without recourse against the State Fair of Virginia.

Upon qualifying for and agreeing to participate in the Scholarship Program, the entry will become the property of the Scholarship Program and the exhibitor will be compensated for his/her entry as set forth in the Scholarship Program.

Eighteen total scholarships will be offered in the Youth Hog program:

Three age groups:

Juniors: 12 and younger as of Sept 30th of the current year

Intermediates: 13-15 as of Sept. 30th of the current year

Seniors: 16-19 as of Sept. 30th of the current year

Ranking of exhibitors will be based on the following:

40% - Live class placing (in an individual class with one animal)

25% - Showmanship

25% - Skillathon

10% - Herdsman/Promotion

Ties will be broken 1st by live placing, 2nd Showmanship and 3rd Skillathon

**Exhibitors must participate in ALL of the above criteria to be eligible for a scholarship.*
